At its June 22, 2021 board of directors meeting a lengthy and difficult review of Stanton finances was completed. As a result of those discussions, a new pricing plan is being put into place.

During the past 18 months we have experienced serious deficits between operational income and expenses. We do not take price increases lightly, but these deficits must be dealt with at this time in order to sustain our operations.

A Great Spring for Soaring by Lou Chouinard – MN Soaring Club (MSC):

The strongest months for soaring in MN are May and June. This year, in early May, we had some of the best soaring conditions ever seen in MN. The MSC members (and one former member flying out of Stanton) were ready to take advantage of these conditions and achieved the following –

New State Records	24 (!)
FAI Badges Awarded / Legs Completed	16
SSA Badges Awarded	2

Private Pilot – Glider Rating	1
Commercial Pilot – Glider Rating	1
CFI – Glider Rating	1

In addition, one flight is in competition for a Central Region SSA Award for the Longest Downwind Dash. It has, indeed, been a great spring for soaring!



The Minnesota Soaring Club was founded in 1959 and is based at Stanton Airfield. MSC has about 60 members. We own 2 two-place gliders, 1 one-place glider, and a Piper PA-18 Super Cub. MSC is an all-volunteer organization. Our instructors volunteer their time to offer instruction to members. A number of our members own private gliders.

Once a pilot gets their license, we encourage them to start the process of earning their Soaring Society of America badges. This badge program is a system of study and demonstrated airmanship that gets progressively harder and more advanced. Once the SSA badges are earned, pilots start working on their FAI (International) badges. The ultimate goal of pursuing the badge process is to become a cross country pilot. A cross country pilot is a soaring pilot who flies beyond gliding distance back to the airport, completes a task to turnpoints they define, and then (hopefully) lands back at Stanton. If they are doing a

"downwind dash", the pilot flies as far as they can and then lands somewhere – hopefully safely and far away from Stanton.

MSC also encourages members to pursue new state records in soaring. Records can be for distance and speed in multiple classes of gliders.

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
